News Mosaic tribute to women



A WOMEN'S Mosaic Wall has been created to mark the upcoming International Women's Day 2018 in

International Women's Day 2018 in Penang. Located at Karpal Singh Drive, the first-of-its-kind mosaic wall with 80 pieces of art will be unveiled on March 4 at 7.30am. Project coordinator Dr Chan Lean Heng said the mosaic artwork was crafted by over 200 people for the 2015 International Women's Day celebration.

Day celebration. "The art was to encourage people to think of the women in their lives and to appreciate them

for all they had done," she said during a press conference near the Blue Sky monument in Karpal Singh Drive recently. She said the launch would also see live performances dedicated to women's unseen contributions to their families and communities their families and communities. Junior Chamber International Pearl's 'Run with Flying Colours' will be held on the same day.

IJM Land Berhad senior manager Ch'ng Ewe Ghee said that the company sponsored RM45,000 for the project. "Having the wall built is part of our social responsibility duties. "We hope it will create more appreciation for women and their contributions," he said. Also present was state Women, Family and Community

Development Committee chairman Chong Eng. A contributor to the wall, Beh Chooi Heah, 61, said she did not expect to see her mosaic artwork become part of a public permanent fixture.

"My piece was based on a photo of an athlete and I can't believe it will be part of this mosaic wall," said Beh.

She volunteers for the Women's Centre for Change office in Seberang Pral. Housewife Ang Suan Wah, 51, said she spent about two hours creating her mosaic artwork. "It was a fun experience," said Ang

Ang. "The biggest challenge was getting the mosaic pieces into the right size," she added.
